Turning pain into empowerment

After a spate of misfortune, illness and a traumatic childhood, enjoying a quiet and restful retirement would be a top priority for most people. But not so for local treasure, Lyn. This 74-year-old dedicates her life to changing systems and attitudes so other women don't have to suffer as she did or worse.

At the age of 58, after decades spent raising four children and a lifelong career as a midwife, Wollongong tenant Lyn found herself divorced, and following the sale of the family home, unable to secure a home loan for herself. Lyn says, "This was the first time being an older woman slapped me in the face."

Not one to give up easily, Lyn eventually found her feet and was able to rent until, upon retiring, she discovered that she could no longer afford market rent on a pension. And that's when her housing crisis really began.

Like many women, Lyn worked part time while her children were young, so her superannuation was not enough to sustain her for long. Rent in the Illawarra was rising, and Lyn was facing homelessness. For a short time, Lyn lived with her daughter and son in law and looked after her grandchildren while their parents worked. It was win-win until a series of untimely events changed everything.

Lyn developed bowel cancer, underwent a brutal bout of treatment and her family moved to WA with work. With the prospect of sleeping in her car looming, Lyn threw everything she had at securing a home and found a property through Housing Trust in 2020. Since recovering from her cancer, instead of putting her feet up for a well-deserved rest, Lyn became a qualified counsellor and threw herself into charity work, advocating for more Affordable Housing and participating in groups to encourage, inspire, and embolden women.

She has a particular passion for helping older women, who are one of the fastest growing homeless demographics thanks in part to the increase in women fleeing homes of domestic violence. Lyn actively pursues opportunities to raise awareness of housing affordability issues. Recently, she was interviewed in the 7:30 Report series Why Women are Angry, she participated in the Illawarra Affordable Housing Forum, was featured in the Illawarra Mercury, and interviewed by ABC Illawarra.

Lyn uses her own experience to educate and empower women. "I grew up in a home with a violent, alcoholic father. My mother stayed until she died because she did not believe she had any options. I want to help women understand they do have options - in living without violence, having somewhere safe to live, options in their careers, how many children they have, when they retire. In ALL decisions."


