
Meet John

At 80 years of age, Housing Trust tenant John tells stories of a life well lived, right here in the Illawarra. Raised by his paternal grandmother, 'a tough old one from Braidwood' as John describes her, he was working on the Port Kembla wharves by age 16 as a gear boy.

"I'd splice the ropes to load and unload ships at Port Kembla, I was there about 10 years. I loved it and met a bunch of really interesting people, servicemen from other countries and locals alike. The work scheduled took me away from my wife Yvonne and two young sons a lot. After not getting to spend much time with my old man when I was little, I decided that wasn't for me, so found new work."

John, like so many men of his era, went into coalmining. "It was a big part of the fabric of the region in those days. I was at Nebo and Huntley as a deputy for most of my working life'. John describes the most memorable day of working in the pit as the day he was sitting miles underground on a loco and suddenly the tracks started lifting and waving around. The entire roof swayed but was held in place with timber. "It was an earthquake in about '64, it didn't last long. As soon as it was over we started cutting coal again. No high vis back then!" John says with a smile.

John is of Scottish heritage of which he is very proud. "One of my ancestors came out in 1810 on a convict



ship as a sergeant in the 80th regiment of the foot. I can trace my ancestry back to Gunn the Great. I have my clan's mottos tattooed on my body".

Swimming wasn't a big part of Johns family's life, even though he spent his childhood on the coast. "I never learnt to swim as a kid. It wasn't until my boys came along I learnt." John then joined Surf Life Saving as a radio officer, working behind the scenes to help save lives. He still volunteers to this day.

An avid collector of memorabilia, John's collection is impressive. Coal lamps, gas barometers, zippo's, dynamite detonators, pocket watches, keyrings, snuff boxes and coins. "These are just some of the things that were gifted to me throughout my working life. I developed a real interest in these collectables. They help us to remember the past in a positive way, and brings me joy every day."

Housing Trust and partners proudly won the Affordable Residential Development prize for Correa Gardens at the Urban Taskforce Australia 2022 Development Excellence Awards.

Correa Gardens is the first partnership between Housing Trust, Traders and Purple and NSW Land and Housing Corporation funded under NSW Government's Communities Plus initiative. The \$22m project completed in October 2021 is now home to 34 local families ensuring them safe, secure and affordable rental housing.
